A BILL

- To impose sanctions with respect to persons that operate in a sector of the economy of the People's Republic of China in which the person has engaged in a pattern of significant theft of the intellectual property of a United States person, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Combatting China's
 - 5 Pilfering of Intellectual Property Act" or the "CCP IP
 - 6 Act".

SEC. 2. IMPOSITION OF SANCTIONS RELATED TO THE THEFT OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY. 2 (a) In General.—The President shall impose the 3 sanctions described in subsection (b) with respect to each person described in subsection (c) that the President determines, on or after the date of enactment of this Act, operates in a sector of the economy of the People's Republic of China in which the person— (1) has engaged in a pattern of significant theft 9 of the intellectual property of a United States per-10 11 son; or (2) has received the intellectual property of a 12 United States person through a pattern of signifi-13 cant theft engaged in by other persons. 14 (b) SANCTIONS IMPOSED.—The sanctions described 15 in this subsection are the following: (1) Asset blocking.—The exercise of all pow-17 ers granted to the President by the International 18 Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 19 et seq.) to the extent necessary to block and prohibit 20 all transactions in all property and interests in prop-21 erty of a person described in subsection (a) if such 22 property and interests in property are in the United 23 States, come within the United States, or are or 24 come within the possession or control of a United 25 States person. 26

1	(2) Aliens ineligible for visas, admission,
2	OR PAROLE.—
3	(A) VISAS, ADMISSION, OR PAROLE.—An
4	alien described in subsection (a) is—
5	(i) inadmissible to the United States;
6	(ii) ineligible to receive a visa or other
7	documentation to enter the United States;
8	and
9	(iii) otherwise ineligible to be admitted
10	or paroled into the United States or to re-
11	ceive any other benefit under the Immigra-

3	(ii) Effect of revocation.—A rev-
4	ocation under clause (i) shall take effect
5	immediately and shall automatically cancel
6	any other valid visa or entry documenta-
7	tion that is in the alien's possession.
8	(c) Persons Described.—A person described in
9	this subsection is one of the following:
10	(1) An individual who—
11	(A) is a national of the People's Republic
12	of China or acting at the direction of a national
13	of the People's Republic of China or an entity
14	described in paragraph (2); and
15	(B) is not a United States person.
16	(2) An entity that is—
17	(A) organized under the laws of the Peo-
18	ple's Republic of China or of any jurisdiction
19	within the People's Republic of China;
20	(B) owned or controlled by individuals who
21	are nationals of the People's Republic of China;

23	(C) owned or controlled by an entity de-

t u	LT DVATITIBO!	THE DEMENTATION.

(1) Penalties.—A person that violates, attempts to violate, conspires to violate, or causes a violation of subsection (b)(1) or any regulation, license, or order issued to carry out that subsection shall be subject to the penalties set forth in subsections (b) and (c) of section 206 of the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1705) to the same extent as a person that commits an unlawful act described in subsection (a) of that section.

- (2) IMPLEMENTATION.—The President may exercise all authorities provided to the President under sections 203 and 205 of the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1702 and 1704) for purposes of carrying out this section.
- 17 (e) Waiver.—The President may waive the imposi-18 tion of sanctions under subsection (a) on a case-by-case 19 basis with respect to a person if the President—
 - (1) certifies to the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the Committee on the Judiciary of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Foreign Relations and the Committee on the Judiciary of the Senate that such waiver is in the national security interests of the United States; and

(2) includes a justification for such certifi-
cation.
(f) TERMINATION OF SANCTIONS.—The President
may terminate sanctions imposed under subsection (a)
with respect to a person if the President certifies to the
Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representa-
tives and the Committee on Foreign Relations of the Sen-
ate that such person is no longer engaging in efforts to
steal intellectual property of United States persons.
(g) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 180 days
after the date of the enactment of this Act, the President
shall submit to the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
House of Representatives and the Committee on Foreign
Relations of the Senate a report that specifies each person
the President determines meets the criteria described in
subsection (a) for the imposition of sanctions.
(h) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
(1) Admitted; Alien.—The terms "admitted"
and "alien" have the meanings given those terms in
section 101 of the Immigration and Nationality Act
(8 U.S.C. 1101).
(2) United states person.—The term
"United States person" means—

1	(A) an individual who is a United States

7	SEC. 3. RESTRICTION ON ISSUANCE OF VISAS.
8	(a) RESTRICTION.—The Secretary of State may not
9	issue a visa to, and the Secretary of Homeland Security
10	shall deny entry to the United States of, each of the fol-
11	lowing:
12	(1) Senior officials in the Chinese Communist
13	Party, including the Politburo, the Central Com-
14	mittee, and each delegate to the 20th National Con-
15	gress of the Chinese Communist Party.

18	(3) Members of the cabinet of the Government
